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Introduction

As the American Rescue Plan Act Child Care Stabilization funds for child care providers start to rollout, it is important to know that these funds can be used for mental health and social and emotional services for staff and children in care. This document is intended to facilitate easier identification of available Early Childhood Mental Health/Social and Emotional services and supports. Please note that it is not all inclusive and will be updated as new information and resources become available.

Each service is categorized, with a brief description of the service, cost, expected duration and contact information for additional details. The categories include:

1. Mental Health Consultation
2. Coaching
3. Reflective Supervision
4. Early Childhood Technical Assistance
5. Training
6. Other

Please note that for training services it is indicated whether the service participates in **The Aspire Registry** (<https://nyworksforchildren.org/the-aspire-registry/learn-more/>) and the **Educational Incentive Program** (<https://www.ecetp.pdp.albany.edu/eip.aspx>).

The Aspire Registry is an online system that provides child care providers with access to a free online professional portfolio that captures the individual's education, employment and professional development in one place. The Aspire Registry also enables providers to find quality trainings that are presented by credentialed and verified trainers and allows New York State Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) training credit to be given.

The **Educational Incentive Program** (EIP) is a scholarship program that helps child care providers pay for training and educational activities, with the intent to build provider knowledge, skills, and competencies to improve the quality of child care. To be eligible for EIP, child care providers must be required to take training and must be caring for children in a program regulated by NYS OCFS or the New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (NYC DOHMH).

Mental Health Consultation

Infant Toddler Mental Health Consultation (ITMHC) Project

The ITMHC Project aims to create a cross-systems, state-wide model of quality infant toddler mental health consultation that will ensure a high level of positive impact with long-term, sustainable improvement in the mental health of New York State's infants and toddlers (ages birth to 3 years old). ITMHC is a partnership between a mental health professional and an early childhood professional or program that is rooted in relationship-based practices, aims to improve the child's social, emotional, and behavioral health and development, and uses skill- and relationship-building efforts with the adult(s) in the child's life. The ITMH Consultants do not provide direct therapeutic services to children or families in this role.

Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation (IECMHC) is offered throughout the state at various Child Care Resource and Referral (CCR&R) agencies, please visit <https://earlycareandlearning.org/itmh/> for a complete list of ITMCHs in your region. There is no cost for this service and the duration of the service varies by program need/request. Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation (ECMHC) Program

Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation (ECMHC) program provides:

1. Consultation on Early Childhood Mental Health and Social-Emotional Development – Provision of programmatic, classroom and child-specific consultation by mental health specialists, typically licensed social workers sometimes paired with special educators aimed at building the capacity of the teachers and caregivers.
2. Service Referrals – Supporting staff to arrange appropriate service referrals for young children and their families experiencing post-traumatic stress and other developmental and mental health issues.
3. Programmatic Consultation – Support to program directors in developing individualized training and consultation services for their respective programs. Support to family workers in developing parent outreach activities and parent training/guidance sessions.
4. Intensive Training in Early Social-Emotional Development and Classroom Management – Delivery of six days of training by ECMH consultants using the evidence based Incredible Years' Incredible Beginnings curriculum as well as other foundational principles of infant health.

Cost: The cost of mental health consultation is \$175 per hour. Included in the cost is the consultant and access to readings and resources the consultant provides.

Duration of support/service: ECMHC provided for one school year. 4-8 hours of weekly consultation depending on the size of the program is recommended. This can be coupled with six days of professional development.

Coaching

Classroom Coaching

Classroom Coaching is a relationship-based process designed to build skills with a focus on goal setting. Coaching includes on-site meetings between coach and coachee - conversations about shared goals and plans for action - observations and support strategies to assist teachers with professional development (planning, delivering, or evaluating instruction) - delivering and developing new materials - sharing resources and providing supportive feedback. This service is offered in virtual, hybrid and in person formats. When a coaching plan is used the coachee can count coaching as part of their annual training hours.

Pyramid Model Practice Based Coaching

The Pyramid Model for Supporting the Social and Emotional Competence of Infants and Young Children is focused on promoting the social and emotional development of infants and young children. The Pyramid Model Classroom Coach works with center-based teachers and family child care (FCC/GFCC) providers to support their implementation of Pyramid Model strategies to help reduce challenging behaviors and strengthen the social and emotional climate in the classroom or FCC. Reflective Supervision

Reflective group supervision is a collaborative relationship for learning, self-exploration and discovery, recognized as a best practice across early childhood disciplines and child-serving systems as a process of shared contemplation and mindfulness aimed to help Infant/ early childhood practitioners: deepen understanding of self, clinical experiences and complexity; examine ideas and emotional material arising out of the work; tolerate a range of emotions, their own and their clients'; amplify reflective function and use of self; solve problems with perceptiveness and translate insights into practice. This service is offered in a virtual, in person and hybrid format.

In later training, providers apply this knowledge and gain practical strategies for trauma informed practice in early childhood education and care. Program for Infant Toddler Caregiving (PITC)

Program for Infant/Toddler Care (PITC), created by WestEd, is a relationship-based approach to caring for infants and toddlers premised on the belief that responsive, respectful care in a relationship is key for supporting early learning, rather than developing lessons for infants to master. By implementing PITC, child care providers learn to find ways to allow for, expand, adapt, and encourage infants' efforts, while being responsive to the infants' own learning agenda. There are six unique program topics: Primary Care, Small Groups, Continuity of Care, Individualized Care, Culturally Responsive Care, and Inclusive Care. All of these topics help to respect that each child is unique and has their own diverse culture, lifestyle, preferences, ability, learning style and needs. NYS-Association of Infant Mental Health (NYS-AIMH) Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health Basics Course

The Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health (IECMH) Basics course features 3 distinct tracks. The first track is for everyone who works with or on behalf of very young children, their families and caregivers. This track covers an overview on IECHMH, such as the definition, typical infant development, attachment, trauma and best practice principles. Track 2 is for anyone who supports the workforce such as a coach, consultant, supervisor or administrator, and prerequisites include taking track 1. This track reviews how to build IECHMH-informed practices, what is needed to sustain strong and safe reflective practices, and what can be barriers of this practice. Track 3 is also offered to supervisors, coaches, and administrators who want to grow and share their reflective practices in a small group that is guided and facilitated by a NYS-AIMH Endorsed Mentor-Clinical professional. This track meets about 2 hours each month and requires approval from NYS-AIMH.
