### Who are we?

The NYS Council on Children and Families (CCF) is a state agency that helps to coordinate child- and family-serving systems to provide easier access to high quality services and supports for New York's children and families.

CCF created the NYS Parent Portal (www.nysparenting.org) as a one-stop, digital resource for information on parenting, child care options, information on child development, how to talk and work with your child's teachers, and much more to support your child and family! 


